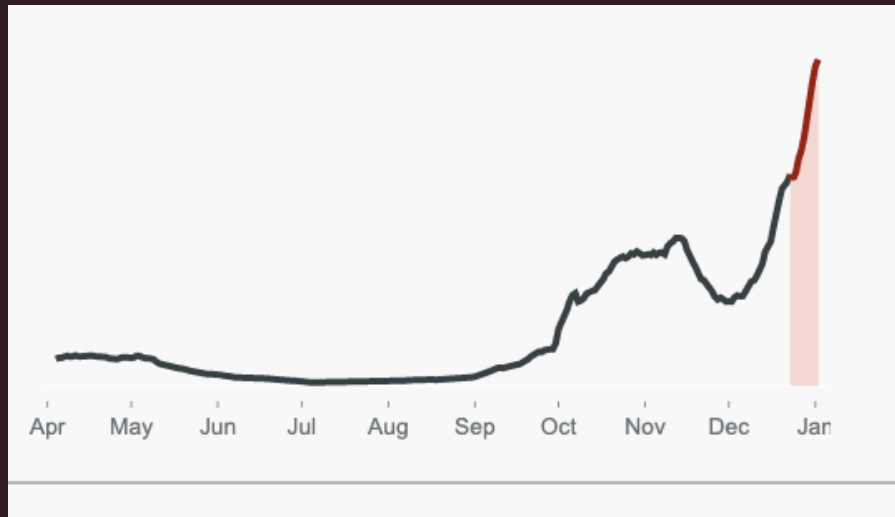

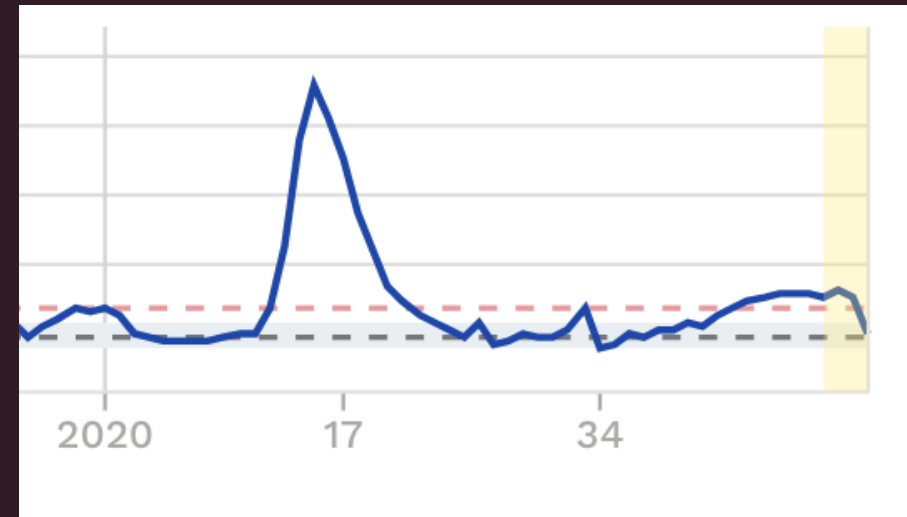
Two ways of looking at coronavirus stats in the UK during 2020

- **Excess mortality (England)**

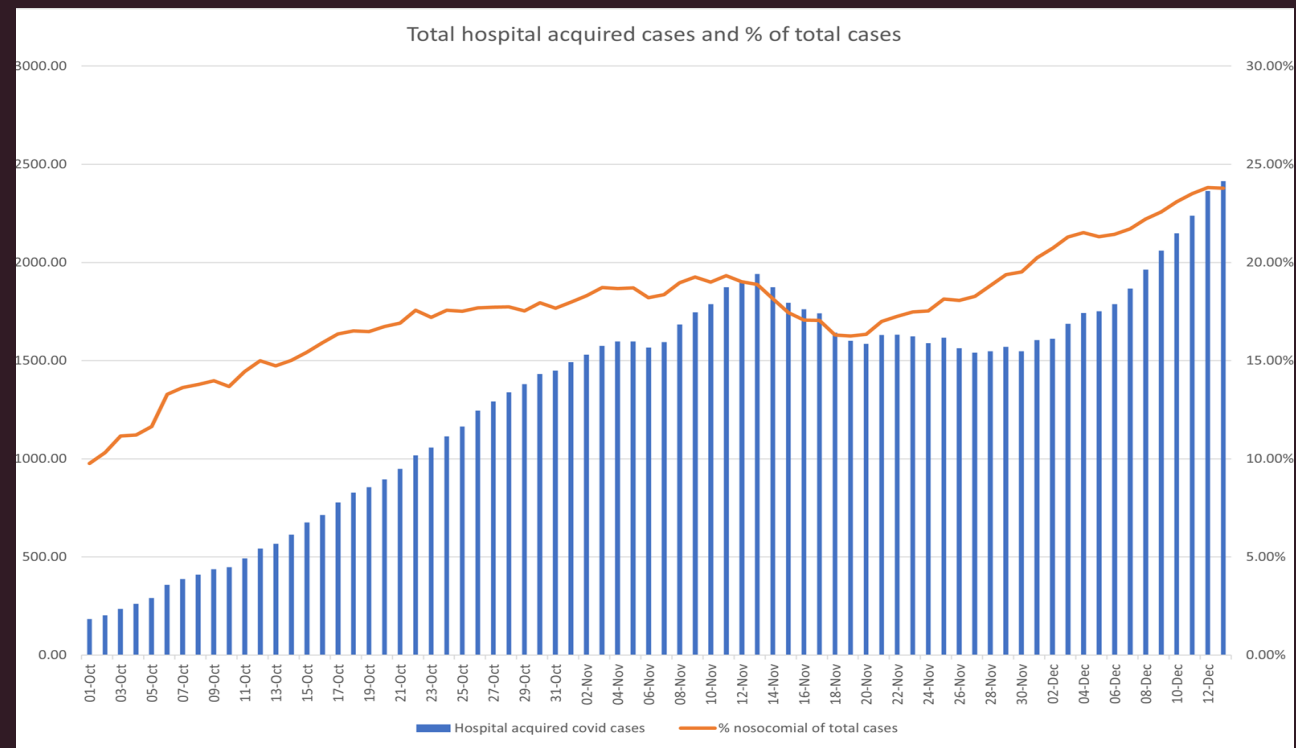

UK hospitals are under additional pressure owing to NHS staff shortages

- **76,200** – the number of NHS staff that were off work on a single day in October 2020*
 - including:
 - 25,293 nursing staff
 - 3,575 doctors
- **93,513** – the highest number of NHS staff that were off work on a single day in November 2020[†]

What could happen to you if you film an 'empty' hospital and post the video on social media?


- You could be arrested for an alleged public order offence and put under long-term surveillance after being bailed

Is the UK government post-marketing adverse event reporting scheme for covid vaccines transparent?

- No.
- While you can record any adverse events you experience through the dedicated Yellow Card scheme, the data are not revealed to the public.

What proportion of a population needs to be immune before cases start to drop?

- Vaccine protagonists claim the 'herd immunity threshold' is 60-70% of the population based on flawed, out-dated model, relying only on antibody status (serological analysis)
- Emerging evidence relying on T-cell immunity from naturally-acquired infection suggests threshold may be as low as 10-20%



What are our top 4 recommendations to kick off 2021?



- **Don't panic** - exposure to chronic stress reduces immune competence. Rely on evidence-based information and critical thinking. Regulate exposure to mainstream media
- **Ensure informed consent** - don't blindly accept vaccination or treatment if you haven't been provided adequate information on risks, benefits and alternate options
- **Take supplemental vitamin D, vitamin C and zinc daily** (see our campaign pages for doses)
- **Beat censorship and unbalanced journalism** and share quality information you deem valuable as widely as you can
